

# **Apprenticeship Programs**

Agricultural apprenticeships offer hands-on experiential learning through an intensive mentorship by a skilled farmer or rancher. New Entry Sustainable Farming Project coordinates the Ag Apprenticeship Learning Network (AgALN), which will become part of the FIELD Network in 2020 (Farm Incubation and Education through Land-Based skills Development). We conduct a yearly survey of apprenticeship programs, and this 2019 data represents 25 program responses, from individual commercial farms and ranches, to University-run apprenticeship programs, and organizations who manage networks of farm and ranch mentors.

Apprenticeship programs typically average 8-12 months of experiential learning on a farm or ranch and serve between 5-9 apprentices or for larger statewide coordinating programs, 15 or more apprentices placed on farms or ranches each year. The average farm or ranch mentor has more than 5 years of experience prior to offering an apprenticeship.

Housing

**50%** of programs cover the cost of housing.



#### Recruitment

Word of mouth is the most successful recruitment practice reported, followed by social media, through relationships with partner organizations, listservs/email lists, and farm websites.



## **Education**

100% have a curriculum, suggested reading materials, and hands-on training

88% have classroom education

**75%** have formal evaluations and offer conferences or technical workshops

50% offer business and financial planning
